Narrative - This term the children will be writing their own narrative from a different perspective based on the book 'BFG' by Roald Dahl.

Non-Fiction— This term the children will also be creating their own instructions on how to make bread!

Science

Summer 1: Our science topic this term is Light. During this unit, children will recognise that they need light in order to see things and that the dark is an absence of light. Children will understand that light is reflected from surfaces and they will recognise that light from the sun can be very dangerous and that they must protect their eyes. Children will be looking at shadows and will understand that shadows are formed when the light from a light source is blocked by an opaque object. During this stage children will see how the size of shadows changes.

Maths

At Snape Wood, we follow the White Rose approach.

In Summer 1, the children will continue to focus on:

- Length and perimeter
- Fractions
- Decimals

Rationale, Hook and Final Celebration:

Rationale: The rationale behind teaching about the Anglo-Saxons and Vikings is to improve their knowledge and understanding chronologically of world History, for them to note connections and contrasts over time periods and for them to understand that different versions of the past may exist and for them to have an understanding of why this may happen.

Hook: The children will experience their own Viking conflict day where they will understand the many disputes they had with the Anglo-Saxons.

Final Celebrations: Children will showcase their learning through a Class museum for all to visit and see lots of information about the Vikings.
