# Application and Reasoning Step 7: Using Capital Letters and Full Stops

Teaching Note: The resources for this step have been designed around most common to least common letters used in high frequency words. You may wish to teach this step following letters using a phonics scheme or your school's handwriting policy.

### **Differentiation:**

Questions 1, 4 and 7 (Application)

Developing Identify the incorrect sentence and rewrite it with the correct punctuation. Questions use single clause sentences and a selection of the most frequently used letters in year 1 high frequency words: E, O, T, A, N, H, R, I, S.

Expected Identify the incorrect sentence and rewrite it with the correct punctuation. Questions use multi-clause sentences (independent clauses only) and a selection of frequently used letters in year 1 high frequency words: D, L, Y, M, W, U, G, F, C, B.

Greater Depth Identify the incorrect sentence and rewrite it with the correct punctuation. Questions use multi-clause sentences (including dependent clauses) and a selection of the least frequently used letters in year 1 high frequency words: K, V, P, X, J, Z, Q.

Questions 2, 5 and 8 (Reasoning)

Developing Explain the mistake made in a sentence. Differentiation same as question 1. Expected Explain the mistake made in a sentence. Differentiation same as question 4. Greater Depth Explain the mistake made in a sentence. Differentiation same as question 7.

Questions 3, 6 and 9 (Application)

Developing Arrange given words to form a sentence and add the missing punctuation.

Differentiation same as question 1.

Expected Arrange given words to form a sentence and add the missing punctuation.

Differentiation same as question 4.

Greater Depth Arrange given words to form a sentence and add the missing punctuation. Differentiation same as auestion 7.

# Application and Reasoning Using Capital Letters and Full Stops

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### **Developing**

1a. Sentence 1 should be circled, and rewritten as: The hat is his.

2a. Imran has not written a capital letter at the start of the sentence.

#### **Expected**

4a. Sentence 1 should be circled, and rewritten as: We saw a wild cat and it hid in a bush.

### **Greater Depth**

### <u>Developing</u>
