## Application and Reasoning Step 1: Capital Letters

## National Curriculum Objectives:

> English Year 1: (1G5.1) Using a capital letter for names of people, places, the days of the week, and the personal pronoun 'I'
> English Year 2: (2G5.1) Use of capital letters to demarcate sentences

## Differentiation:

Questions 1, 4 and 7 (Application)
Developing Order 4 words to make a complete sentence and add 1 capital letter.
Expected Order 6 words to make a complete sentence and add 2 capital letters. Include personal pronouns.
Greater Depth Order 6 words to make a complete sentence and add as many capital letters as needed. Include personal pronouns.

Questions 2, 5 and 8 (Application)
Developing Identify the word that would complete the sentence and also requires a capital letter. 2 options to choose from.
Expected Identify the word that would complete the sentence and also requires a capital letter. 3 options to choose from.
Greater Depth Identify the word that would complete the sentence and also requires a capital letter. 3 options to choose from. Other options match the sentence but only one needs a capital letter. Including personal pronouns.

Questions 3, 6 and 9 (Reasoning)
Developing Explain whether the child has correctly identified how many capital letters their sentence needs. 1 or 2 capital letters.
Expected Explain whether the child has correctly identified how many capital letters their sentence needs. 2 or 3 capital letters.
Greater Depth Explain whether the child has correctly identified how many capital letters their 2 sentences need. 4 or 5 capital letters. Including personal pronouns.
