Anti-Word League Newspaper Report Notes

You have two jobs:

Firstly, imagine you are one of the victims of the Anti-Word League (based on the character notes in the <u>UKS2 BBC Teach Live Lesson</u> <u>World Book Day PowerPoint</u>). The Anti-Word League has stolen some words from a book or document that is precious to you.

Secondly, pair up with a classmate and use the following questions to interview them in character as a victim. They will also need to interview you in character and you will each use your notes to write your newspaper report.



Who is the person that you are interviewing? (Imagine them and include their job, the home, etc.)
Where was the person at the time of the event? (Write a town/city and the country.)
When did they realise their words had been stolen?
What document did the Anti-Word League steal words from? You will need to explain the significance of this to you/your job/sentiments.

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What makes you suppose that the Anti-Word League is responsible? (You must include facts.)
What will happen if the Anti-Word League is not stopped? (Explain any danger that the public is in.)
What have the police been doing to investigate this crime?
What can the public do to help the investigation?
Think of a title for your report. It should be catchy and short.
