Rationale, Hook and Final Celebration:

This half term is focussed on living things and their habitats. This will predominantly through science with key questions such as, how can we categorise living things? How do we know something is alive?

This will be complemented in in science with bread baking and investigations on using natural and brewers yeast to make bread.

Children will end the unit by growing their own microorganisms (mushrooms), designing a dish that combines a yeasted and funghi product before creating and sharing it with parents.

Snape Wood PRIDE and the World (PSHE)
