## Let's Talk about Sex Answers

It's quiz time! Take the quiz to see how much you can remember about the topic of sex.

- 1. What is sexual intercourse?
  - Sexual intercourse is sexual contact between individuals involving penetration, especially the insertion of a man's erect penis into a woman's vagina.
- Why might two people want to have sexual intercourse?
   Two people might want to have sexual intercourse to make a baby or to show their partner that they really love them.
- 3. How old must both people in a relationship be, in the UK, to have sexual intercourse?

  Both people must be aged 16 or over to have sexual intercourse.
- 4. Can any two people above the age of consent have a sexual relationship?

  Any two people above the age of consent can have a sexual relationship as long as both people want to and as long as they are not closely related, such as a parent, child, brother, sister, or grandparent.
- 5. What does having a 'crush' or 'fancying someone' mean?

  Having a crush or fancying someone means you feel excited when you see that person, you wish that person could be your girlfriend or boyfriend, you really admire that person and may want to be like them, and you like looking at pictures of that person and maybe have a picture on your wall or on your phone.
- 6. What happens during sexual intercourse that means a baby may be conceived?

  During sexual intercourse the man releases sperm into the woman's vagina and the sperm fertilises an egg.
- 7. What can a couple do if they want a sexual relationship, but do not want to make a baby? If a couple want to have sexual intercourse but do not want to make a baby, the woman could take the contraceptive pill, if prescribed by her doctor, and the man could wear a condom on his penis to catch the sperm.
- What does STI stand for?
   STI stands for, Sexually Transmitted Infection.

 People can protect themselves from getting an STI by the man wearing a condom during sexual intercourse.
